# Education in the Era of Pandemic: Leading and Inspiring Through Uncertain Times Report

Education has seen an unprecedented change in the era of #COVID 19. Educational Institutions are facing continuous challenges to keep the lamp of knowledge enlightened. They are continuously coming up with innovative ideas and practices for ensuring the efficient and effective learning and assessment programs through latest technology. Still there are lots of apprehensions and issues that are looming around. UGC is continuously issuing guidelines on the precautionary and preventive measures to be taken by educational institutions.

In this innovative seminar to we had created a unique platform for educationist to deliberate through live webinar and online video lecture series Education in the Era of Pandemic – Leading and Inspiring through uncertain Times. Four pillar themes of the seminar were ICT enabled Teaching Learning, ICT enabled Evaluation Process, Issues and Challenges & Psycho Social Impact. We have received 36, 04, 15, 18 papers on above themes respectively.

Total 127 participants have registered for the seminar. We had received paper presentation proposals from 11 states and 2 Union Territory of India such as West Bengal, Delhi, Daman, Haryana, Arunachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Manipur, Gujarat etc. The participation in the seminar ranges from teachers, research scholars, assistant professor, to Professors and Heads from various universities of India. About 75 paper presentation proposal have been received from the various universities of the country. Out of these, we have been able to accommodate only 55 selected paper presentations in seminar due to time constraint.

#### DAY-1

The two-day online seminar was started with welcome address by **Dr. Divya Sharma** and an introduction of online national Seminar on Education in the Era of Pandemic: Leading and Inspiring Through Uncertain Times





The key note address was given by **Prof. R.G. Kothari**, Former VC, VNSUG, Surat and Dean & Head; Professor (Retd.), Faculty of Education and Psychology, M. S. University, Vadodara on the *Education in the Era of Pandemic*. He focused on the issue and possible way to education during this time. He put stress on use online education with utmost care and while students were in need of teachers' support in their learning during the time of pandemic.

It was followed by first panel discussion on *Higher Education: Challenges, Intervention & Impact*. In this session **Prof. Prof. H.B. Patel**, Prof. & Dean, Central Uni. of Gujarat, Gandhinagar had focused on how we the teachers can come out with innovative practice by using various application to fulfil student's requirement.


Second speaker in panel, **Dr. Niloo Ghosh**, Principal, D.D. work from home through different mean. It's the duty of teacher to make student familiar with this new learning culture so that they can develop proper attitude towards mobile education.






#### **DAY-2**

The day two of online national seminar was started by welcome address given by **Dr. Dipika Patel** and an introduction of online national Seminar on Education in the Era of Pandemic:

Leading and Inspiring Through Uncertain Times.

Education: Challenges Intervention & Impact was the theme of third panel discussion of the seminar. Dr. Sanjay Pandagale, Associate Professor, RIE Bhopal discussed about "ICT Enabled Evaluation Process". He had put his view that we have to make examination more interesting if we are using the online system for it. He explained how different applications like Google form, Hot Potatoes, poll daddy, survey monkey and RubiStar can be used for this purpose.



Second panelist, **Dr. Madhumita Bhattacharya**, Principal, Podar International School, Gandhinagar had discussed about "Psycho Social Impact among Learners". She explained how her school had started the systemic virtual learning. She was of opinion that ultimately teaching – learning process matters not the physical infrastructure of classes. She also discussed about how this scenario is affecting mental health of students. Behavioral shift it has brought.

Fourth panel discussion was held on *Overcoming Issues and Challenges- Efforts by Universities in present Pandemic Scenario* among Prof. Satish Shukla, Dr. Nidatt Barot and Prof. Divya Sharma.

During this session Dr. Shukla (Professor, Dept. of Education, Gujarat University, Ahmedabad) viewed that many teachers and universities had started using different online platforms but it's not enough. In current situation virtual education is appreciated but for higher education teachers, administration, parents and government should collaboratively prepare policy to achieve the defined objectives.



Dr. Barot (Dean, Faculty of education, Saurashtra University, Rajkot) discussed about how to reach students through virtual platform. He explained that in this crucial time we should make learning joyful and flexible so that students can enjoy learning and came back with a fresh and energetic mood for post pandemic semester.

Dr. Barot had posted a case study where they had used YouTube as virtual platform for their 1500 students. He showed how to boost up confidence of teachers, students and management and enhance teaching learning process.

Dr. Sharma (Head B.Sc. B.Ed. Program IITE & Director Special Education, IITE) discussed about major challenges at university system.

She had explained how they are doing blended learning on Google classroom, Zoom classes @ IITE. They are focused on regular programs as well as their classes of competitive exams. She had also provided some effective suggestion about how to take exam & post pandemic opening of College and universities.


First and second panel discussion was followed by question – answer session by participants, where they participated very actively and enthusiastically.

Overall it was a great experience to reach across the nation and various views on education scenario in this pandemic in such a short duration of time, with one of its kind online seminar.









# NEP 2020-Vision for a Prospective Nation Report

Center of Education, Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Gandhinagar in collaboration with MES's PCER, Chembur organised a National Level Live Webinar titled NEP 2020- Vision for a Prospective Nation on 8th September, 2020. There were 415 registered participants who viewed the live program. The session was in alignment with Sustainable Goal 4: Quality Education.

Dr. Reni Francis, Principal, PCER, Chembur, Mumbai, addressed and welcomed all the audience with a meaningful message on how NEP 2020 would bring a revolution in the field of education.

There were five eminent speakers touching on different aspects of NEP-2020. The first speaker, Dr. Kalpesh H Pathak, Principal & Director, Center of Education, IITE, Gandhinagar, Gujarat highlighted his perspectives of NEP-2020 from the point of teacher education. Not just changes in TET and BEd courses, NEP also suggests policies for teachers who have already been hired including mandatory courses, setting up of national professional standards, no transfer policy and digital management of hiring and vacancies in schools across the country.

The second speaker, Dr. Asawari Bhave, Dean-Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences, Head-School of Education & Research as well as PhD Chief Coordinator, Research Cell, MIT Art, Design & Technology University, Pune, spoke on how NEP 2020 will transform higher education. The biggest highlights of the NEP 2020 are, 1) A single regulator for higher education institutions, 2) Multiple entry and exit options in degree courses,3)Discontinuation of MPhil programmes, 4) Low stakes board exams and 5) Common entrance exams for universities.

The third speaker, Mr. Mahesh Jain, Grade Lead at The Somaiya School, Mumbai stressed on reforms the NEP has brought up at Primary and Secondary level of education which includes The 5+3+3+4 system, teaching up to class five in mother tongue or regional language, lowering the stakes of board exams etc.

The fourth speaker, Ms. Namarata Saxena, Program Director for early years and curriculum head at Mahatma Education Society, Navi Mumbai gave her perspectives on the New Education Policy and Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE). ECCE will be delivered through a) standalone Anganwadis; b) Anganwadis co-located with primary schools; c) preprimary schools/sections covering at least age 5 to 6 years co-located with existing primary schools; and d) stand-alone pre-schools - all of which would recruit workers/teachers specially trained in the curriculum and pedagogy of ECCE.

The final speaker, Ms. Vasundhara Kaul, with 13+ years of rich experience covering work experience across the banking sector, higher education institutions, schools and NGOs across various geographies (India & UAE - Dubai, Sharjah & Abu Dhabi) highlighted perspectives about NEP 2020 from a psychological point of view. She gave real life examples to share how it is and will help in developing a healthy psyche upon students, teaching fraternity, as well as parents.

The audiences highly appreciated all the speakers, applauded after each talk, and raised a few healthy queries to the experts through you tube chat forum. This initiated a lot more discussion.


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



#### ART IN EDUCATION WORKSHOP

#### Report

NCF, 2005 states that. 'we must bring the arts squarely into the domain of curriculum, infusing them in all areas of learning while giving them an identity of their own at relevant stages'. Art has always existed as an expression for life, culture, traditions and science. NCF stressed on including art as a subject at all stages of education covering all 4 major spheres, i.e. music, dance, visual art and theatre.

Art in Education is included as an important subject in 2 Year B.Ed. Curriculum. Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Center of Education, Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Gandhinagar organized One Week Workshop from 12<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> December 2020. The workshop was organized with the purpose to orient the teacher educators and prospective teachers about the ways and means of integrating components of music, dance, visual art and drama in the curriculum by creating curricular plugins.


The workshop was inaugurated on 12<sup>th</sup> December 2020 by the Vice Chancellor of IITE, Dr. Harshad A. Patel in presence of Shri. T.S. Joshi (Director, GCERT), Dr. Vijay Sevak (Ex. Associate Professor, V.T.Choksi College of Education, Surat) and Dr. Himanshu Patel (Registrar, IITE) and the Principals of various affiliated colleges of IITE. Professor Divya Sharma (IQAC Coordinator and Convener of the workshop) welcomed the guest and introduced the objectives of the workshop. The coordinators of the workshop were Mr. Yogesh Pawar and Mr. Amit Barot.

The first session was Drama in Education: Understanding the Concept which was taken by Dr. Vijay Sevak Ex. Associate Professor, V.T.Choksi College of Education, Surat. He introduced the participants with various ideas of drama and how they can use them in teaching students. The second session was of Music – Hymns, Shlokas Stotras, Prayer Songs etc. by Mr. Amit Barot Assistant Professor, Center of Education, IITE, Gandhinagar. The third session was of Fine Arts – Elements or art, Painting, Rangoli, Clay Modelling etc. by Mr. Yogesh Pawar Assistant Professor, Center of Education, IITE, Gandhinagar.

Both the session introduced the participants with the basic concepts of music and art. They also enlightened the participants about how the different line forms are used in various subjects. Fourth session was on Dance: Taal, Laya, Matra etc. writing of taal and dance forms by Ms. Jigna Dixit, A Kathak Exponent who enthusiastically represented various mudras and taals and motivated the participants to express themselves artistically.

The last session was on Curricular Plugins for Embedding Art in Education by Prof. Divya Sharma, Professor, Center of Education, IITE, Gandhinagar. The participants were given ideas as to how they can integrate various forms of arts in the curriculum. Some examples include Hindustani Classical Music can be aligned with the teaching of Mathematics. However, this is not possible for a teacher without the knowledge of music note. Haikus (Traditional form of poetry in Japan with 17 syllables and is used to show interrelationship between mind and nature).

The workshop received participation from all over Gujarat and other states across the country. 1600 students of 26 Institutions and 200 educators and professionals across the country participated in the workshop. The workshop received great reviews and was telecast live on the You Tube Channel of IITE.



#### Workshop on Reflective Reading

#### 2 to 7 January, 2021

#### **Report**

"The book is the door to culture.

Reading is the cradle of personal development. "

Reflective Reading Workshop organized by IITE to make this statement meaningful. Was performed at. The four-day event was organized by Sudhir Tandel and co-organizer Professor Megha Tadvi and researcher Bhavini Parmar on January 2, 3, 6 and 7, 2021 respectively. The main objective of which was to develop different semantic and contemplative thinking styles regarding the subject of reflective reading as well as to cultivate different techniques regarding reading.


The keynote speaker was Dr. Mahendra Chotalia, an eminent expert and thinker in the field of education. Prasad of Gyanganga is also found in Teachers Tune. Reading is a purposeful activity and a wonderful process. Based on the opinions of various thinkers, it can be said that reading is a process of meaning making. The process of acquiring new knowledge through the reader's own knowledge, the knowledge indicated in the information presented for reading and the multi-dimensional exchange that takes place during the reading mode. Thus, the process of reading is a contemplative, creative, scientific as well as psychological process. So we can say with certainty that through reading, thoughts, behaviors, practices, speech and personality can be constantly evolving and expanding. Not only this, with the help of reading you are able to cultivate feelings and emotions.

Reading is a skill that also helps us to develop life skills. Reflective reading is the reading that takes the text created by the creator to the reader at the same level of realization. So that one can relate to one's life. It requires semantic reading through which the reader, using introspection and understanding, reflects on the situation. Or, how can he make his work innovative and unique? Then when the reader asks himself a reflective question, it can be called Reflection in Action and when he asks a question before or after reading, it can be called Reflection on Action. Thoughts, behaviors, speech and even personality were becoming inspiring to keep constantly evolving and expanding.

What is reading on the first day of the workshop? With a variety of interesting, humorous and thoughtful activities about it, everyone was actively engaged in the workshop to understand the meaning and essence of the sentence. Listening is reading with ears and writing is speaking with fingers. It was considered more appropriate to prepare the lessons as thoughtfully as possible than to give the trainees more lessons with logical talk about this. Explaining the meaning of existence with simplicity and effectiveness through the story of the pencil. That is, your value is inside you, not the wood outside.

Thus, he inspired everyone with a method that opens the eyes, ears and mind and compels thinking with value. The second and third days, respectively, began with humor and contemplation. Regarding the components of cognition, Ability to learn emphasized that the learner should think independently through self-study for the ability to learn.

Each of the tricks was experimented with by explaining the reading techniques with an accurate example. Interpretation or sentimentality only occurs when the surface of information is touched by observation, only by making a deep investigation and making predictions. Creativity with thoughtfulness and interpretation is essential to expand thinking. Not only that, it is important to understand the author's purpose and social considerations for writing. What would you do if you were in this situation? If Gandhiji meets you, what question will you ask?





Successful attempts were made to take the trainees to the level of empathy through such specific thought-provoking questions. The language of information in terms of preparation for reflective reading, accurately presented through charts how to analyze the game with purpose.

On the fourth day, he presented his thoughts regarding Reflective teacher, Reflective perception, Reflection in Action and Reflection on Action. In which if man does not do reflection he does not fall in the category of man. Introducing the idea was a test to get an idea of the contemplation with it.

Through which each person can get his own reflection that, they are on the threshold of contemplation, contemplation has begun. That, using contemplation, is capable of contemplation. Thus, each one of them got the crown of contemplative ability through test.








Understanding through this chart of knowledge, situation and contemplation based on John Dewey's idea. The philosopher discussed how to move forward with Shawn's idea to make the teaching style appropriate and effective. Consciousness of what we are doing with the thoughts of John Dewey also gives contemplation.



Reflection in Action to know the situation immediately, what to do? Decision making must be implemented immediately. Analysis of experience in the context of Reflection on Action, with a consideration for one's own readiness. The four-day workshop was also becoming important for the development of reflective reading, thinking and personality.

IQAC, Indian Institute of Teacher Education organized a National Webinar on, 'DIGITAL CONSULTATION: MY NEP 2020' on 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2021, Friday.

#### The objective of the program was

- To create awareness about the initiative of DIGITAL CONSULTATION which was
  envisaged by NCTE to draw in suggestions/inputs/membership under the bottom up
  approach for overall coherence in preparing the document on teacher policy for
  sustainable change in the Teacher Education sector.
- 2. To motivate the participants to register at the portal and then after the webinar post the suggestions and inputs based on the discussion and understanding of the concept.

#### **Target Audience and Participants**

The target audience was teacher education professional, academicians, teachers and other stake holders in the education system. 106 participants registered from across the country representing 9 states including Gujarat, New Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Haryana, Bihar, Tamil Nadu, Odisha and West Bengal. The participants included members from two regional committees Western Regional Committee and Northern Regional Committee. Dr. Banwari Lal Natiya, Chairperson, NRC, NCTE and Dr. Nalini Patil, Member WRC, NCTE were among the esteemed guests. Faculty from higher education, teacher educators and many senior eminent educationists participate in the webinar

#### **Program Brief**

Program started with the brief introduction of the webinar and guests by Dr. Divya Sharma, Professor and IQAC Head, IITE, Gandhinagar. A brief overview is presented herewith.

Dr. Harshad A. Patel., Vice Chancellor and IQAC Chairperson, IITE, in his Presidential Address, commented on the beneficial suggestions right from grass root level in framing of robust and National Education Policy document in 2020. He further commented that now NCTE holds the responsibility of drawing valuable suggestions/ inputs for two important aspects: National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST) and National Mentoring Mission (NMM). He also said that this is the time when the education fraternity at should actively participate and to contribute to the framing of policy. This modern digital era has given each and every stake holders an opportunity to put forth their suggestions. He welcomed and motivated the participants to submit fruitful suggestions in the webinar.

**Dr. Ravindra Kadu, Chairperson, and WRC NCTE.**, thanked Vice Chancellor, for arranging the webinar at such a short notice and pointed that it is a good platform for bringing people together. He proposed that a joint proposal of suggestion from WRC can be sent to NCTE. Alternatively each individual can submit their suggestion through NCTE portal. He highlighted two parts — National Mentoring Mission (NMM) and National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST) and noted that it's the need of the hour. He cited Professional Standards for Teachers Education proposed in NEP, 2020 mandate and gave suggestions as listed:

- 1. **Professional Standards for Physical Infrastructure**: Standards for physical as well as the ICT (Distance Education, MOOCs etc.) related standards to be defined with reference to quality and approachability of the students.
- 2. Set Priorities and Prepare Ideal Institutes of Teacher Educations
- 3. **Bifurcate, align and propose Professional Standard for Teachers with** 5+3+3+4 **structure of NEP, 2020**: Professional Standard for Teachers at different stage will help to address the needs of the students and will be as per expectation expectations of NEP 2020
- 4. Upcoming National Curriculum Framework to be aligned with NEP, 2020 and both should be taken into consideration for NPST.

- 5. Proposed teacher education programs to be aligned with 5+3+3+4 in NEP, 2020: He pointed that children at each stage have diverse needs which require unique set of teaching methods, pedagogy and learning experiences.
- 6. Entry to teacher education courses to be provided only through competitive exams: Align Teacher Eligibility Test with professional standards related to qualities, proficiency, psychological abilities, and acquaintance to child psychology. Knowledge needed for the teacher to be predefined and the competitive exam should evaluate these components at the entry level in order to ensure the selection of efficient prospective teacher.
- 7. **Internship and pedagogy to be given maximum importance:** Evaluation of teaching skills to be made important. Distribution of pedagogy subjects to take place across 4 years. Clusters for internship to be identified based on quality and grading of the school. The teaching method should be matched with not only type of subject but with also type of student and level of students available in different internship cluster. This will help in improving the professional standards of the teachers. The prospective teacher should be engaged in maximum internship clusters.
- **Dr. Anil Kumar Sharma, Regional Director, WRC, NCTE** congratulated and complemented IITE Team for the platform provided for deliberation in NPST and NMM. He defined standards as explicit elements of high quality effective teaching in 20<sup>th</sup> century schools which leads to improve educational outcomes for students by providing a framework. He said that standards help to develop common understanding and language for discourse between teachers, teacher educators, teacher organizations, professionals and the public and also inform the development of professional learning goals. Suggestions on NPST proposed by him are:
  - 1. **High quality standards to be the core of teaching profession**: Program for International Standard Assessment (PISA) approach should be binding force to ensure that the future teachers to be prepared on the principal of PISA.
  - 2. Cultural change exchange framework to be established between India and other western countries like U.S., U.K. or Australian government in order to orient and refresh all international standard.
  - 3. **Internship, training on blended learning** for all teachers irrespective of level must be made mandatory in letter and spirit.

- 4. **Collaboration and use of teacher portfolio** to be the ways and means of making the standard work.
- 5. **Creative and innovative framework** to be prepared in order to ensure that all teachers shall be trained on these lines

**Dr. Anil Kumar, Member, WRC, NCTE** thanked the Vice Chancellor for the organization of webinar. He motivated and guided participants for posting suggestions on NCTE portal. The presentation of Dr. Anil Kumar included brief overview of the concept. According to him

**Professional standards will provide a holistic view** of what makes professional teacher, provide interpretation of what a professional might be doing seen through the lens of the teacher, essential tool for informing and supporting continuing professional development, help to drive culture change within the teacher education, will give detailed guidance on how to evidence the recommended teacher qualification.

**Professional Standards to include**: **Input**— Infra, student, teacher, curriculum, governing rules and regulations etc. **Process**-teaching learning and assessment; **Output**: competent student with desired ability. The role of teacher is of a facilitator and guide who creates conducive climate for learning and not p, the one of information provider. The changing role of teacher to be the focus of NPST document.

**NPST document to be based on NEP, 2020:** Role of NCTE is important and they should base document on robust education research, observed effective practice across all parts of country, opinion and views of experts and practices.

#### He cited 4 parts of NCTE Portal and informed what is to be included:

- Part 1 Teacher Quality Honesty, integrity, strong content knowledge, up to date skill, positive relationship with parents and pupil, ability to interconnected, interdependence and able to reflect for multidimensional task,
- 2. **Part II** Self-development guide, research tool, self-assessment tools, digital illustrations, videos and demonstration posters.
- Part III- content knowledge, pedagogy knowledge, curriculum planning and development, uses of required ICT tools and communication assessment, personal and professional development and practice, continuous professional development, learning

environment, community linkages and professional engagements, advance skills, code of conduct, learning of Indian language as per 8<sup>th</sup> schedule of constitution.

4. **Part IV**- Other inputs/opinion – if you found suitable to be incorporated in the draft NPST. The points missed in the above document can be presented here. The portal allows you only 500 words to fill part 4.

#### He further gave examples for suggestions which are

**Up to date Skills** – TL Skills to be updated through online and offline programs, attending conference seminars, reflecting upon literature researches, self-reflection.

Self-Assessment tools – Academic audit, feedback for stakeholder

**Pedagogy knowledge, curriculum planning and development**- skill enhancement through online offline certifications

**Continuous professional development** –regular assessment by self and colleagues, mandatory refresher course after 3/5 years




**National Mentoring Mission:** NCTE is collecting suggestions for Transaction Mode of Mentoring in 4 sections – Blended, Traditional, Combined and Other

This was followed by the questions of the participants and discussion. The discussion was interactive between the members of regional committees and the participants. Dr. Hardshad Patel during the discussion pointed out that the country does not have the standards at present but standards can be developed now to address futuristic needs. Dr. Ravindra Kadu remarked on the comment of one of the participant Dr. Sanjay Sharama and said teachers security and safety in academic as well as economic is very important. Vice Chancellor, Dr. Harshad Patel commented that social and financial security is very important and this is included in the Professional Standards. Dr. Banwari Lal Natiya also commented on the importance of social and financial security and said that 92% of the teacher education institutions are private and there is no financial security of the teacher in theses institution. He further commented that if the teachers are not granted social and financial security then the Professional Standards can neither be framed nor implemented effectively. NCTE should also play an important role in taking cognizance of the complaints received for salary related issues. So the point of economic security should be given importance in professional standards. Dr. Anil Kumar commented that the standards are set for salry but that has to be followed strictly .Dr. Ravindr Kadu commented that NEP, 2020 has suggested monitoring committee at National and State level for such work and it needs to be implemented and in these institution that there are number of institutions who are running with fake institutional orders. There is a need for NCTE to update the data. Dr. Harshad Patel said that we should be optimistic and standards should be designed in such a fashion that make Teacher Education proud and earn respect for it. He further said that if the standards were not there and are not been followed does not imply that standards can't be maintained and developed for future. He said that there is a need to set the standards in constructive fashion for safety and security of teacher. Dr. Anil Kumar said that there is a scope to raise such points in part 4 of the comments. Dr. Banwari Lal Natiya pointed that he has requested some change in the software of suggestion portal of NCTE like mandatory upload of documents. Dr. Harsha Patel commented that he will take this opportunity to tell that the issue of PAR is resolved and case of PAR is won be NCTE. Out of more than 18000 institutions only 5000 institutions have submitted the PAR. Now NCTE should give time to those institutions who have not submitted PAR and should not allow admissions in those institutions till they submit PAR. Dr. Banwari Lal Nativa commented that action should be taken on fake institutions. The NCTE needs to update the data. Dr. Harshad Patel commented that action can

be taken on nonfunctional institutions as per the recommendations of Justice Verma committee. The discussion with the participants was interactive.

It was recommended to increase the last date of submission of suggestions. The program ended with the vote of thanks.


# Professional Ethics among Faculty and Staff: Code of Conduct Date: 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2021






#### **STTI Gandhinagar**
