Strategic Plan - IDP 2022


A Strategic Plan - Institutional Development Plan (IDP) of coming five years is elaborated here considering the reference year 2022 - 2023.

 5. Philosophy and psychology of education in the light of Indian pedagogy and contemporary development.


As per the provision in IITE Act, various Research Councils can be formed to promote the fundamental research as per the objectives of IITE.






1.2.4 Research Funding from IITE

As per the provision of IITE Act the Research Councils can appoint maximum 25 fellows for research fellowships. 

To provide integrated courses in teacher education, marked and defined by value-education, global outlook, and interdisciplinary.





2. Guru Drona Skill Development Department (GDSDD)


GDSDD provides 24 skills to the UG students at 3:30 pm after their academic session. They have get involved in the classes regularly according their chosen skill.

2. Institutions that have been recognized w.e.f. session 2021-22 is not required to fill PAR for the session 2020-21.
3. **Institute Registration:** - Institute shall register itself at the designated portal i.e. (www.ncte.gov.in/PAR) with the requisite information.
4. **Principal/Director/HOD/Trustee** duly authorized by the Chairman/Secretary of the Trust/Society/Company of the applicant institution shall submit his/her authorization letter for filing of PAR.
5. **Payment:** - Institutions shall do the required payment i.e., Rs. 5000/- for Govt. Institutions and Rs. 15000/- for other category Institutions.
6. The PAR processing fees are not refundable.
7. Those institutions who have already filled up PAR for the academic session 2018-19 are also required to fill PAR again in the revised format for the academic session 2020-21. These institutions are not required to pay PAR processing fee as the PAR for the academic session 2018-19 could not be processed due to orders of the Hon'ble High Court. These institutions are required to reset their password using the forgot password option to fill up the revised PAR.
8. The web link to fill up online PAR will remain active from 01/10/2021 to 31/01/2022 (till 11.59 p.m.). Institutions are advised to fill the online PAR well in time/advance, without waiting until the last date of applying to avoid any network congestion/hassle. NCTE will not be responsible for any inconvenience caused due to network error.
9. Multiple registrations are not permitted.
10. Institute shall get the unique ID after registration for any further communication.

11. Applicants are required to provide a valid Email ID and Mobile number as the automated messages will be sent to the only valid Email ID and Mobile Number.

21. NCTE will not be responsible for any payment failure due to the network congestion. Applicants are advised to initiate and submit it well in time.



Date: 22nd to 24th December 2021



4. CADETS APPEARED FOR B & C CERTIFICATE EXAM




9. CATC CAMP ATTENDED BY CADETS – SECOND YEAR






19. WORLD TOBACCO DAY




Amendment in Statute, Ordinances & Regulations:

As part of innovative practices, inspection was carried out in online mode for these colleges by duly constituted Local Inspection Committees (LIC). On the basis of recommendations and reports of these LIC, permanent affiliation has been granted to 09 colleges by the Academic Council. Affiliation has been extended for the academic year 2022-23 for other 09 colleges by the Academic Council.



Subject Experts:

University has to prepare the panel for subject experts under Section 5 for constitution of Selection Committee recommended by “UGC Regulations on minimum qualification for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in University and Colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education, 2018”. Academic Branch has updated the list of the subject experts list, which has been approved by the Academic Council.

Recruitment and Teacher Recognition at Affiliated Colleges

During this year, process was carried out for the recognition of teachers of the affiliated DIET colleges and College of Education, Nani Daman. Duly constituted committee scrutinized applications received for these teachers and submitted reports based on it. These reports were approved at the 17th Meeting of the Academic Council. 222 teacher of various DIET colleges were given teacher

recognition letters, out of them 125 teachers are recognized conditionally. Similarly, 5 teachers from College of Education, Nani Daman are also issued teacher recognition letters.

Recruitment for the post of Adhyapak Sahayak has been carried out by Office of Commissioner of Higher Education, Gujarat State. There are 54 vacancies in different subject methods for Education subject in 28 colleges affiliated to IITE. Academic Branch provided list of Vice Chancellor nominee and Subject Experts as per UGC Regulations for the purpose of interview. Applications for teacher recognition have been received for this recruitment process.

M.A./ M.Sc. M.Ed. additional Intake approval from NCTE:

As a part of student support to serve the society, IITE has applied for additional intake of 50 seats for M.A./M.Sc.-M.Ed. (3 Year Integrated Innovative Programme) at NCTE during current year. University has already get sanction for 100 seats for this course from the NCTE.

Approval of the B.A./B.Sc.B.Ed.- Special Education Programme

Application was made for the recognition of B.A./B.Sc.B.Ed.- Special Education Programme to Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi. On the basis of the Joint Assessment Report of the Inspection Team Visit at the IITE, RCI has given approval for this programme for five academic sessions (2020-21 to 2025-26) with an intake of 30 candidates per batch.

Creation of Centre – Centre of Digital Education

As per provision of the IITE Act, Section 6(4)(v), Centre of Digital Education has been created as a Centre of the IITE and Dr. Viral Jadav, Associate Professor, Centre of Education has been given charge of Director of this Centre.

Advance Study in Education (IASE)

Indian Institute of Teacher Education has been selected as an Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (IASE) by Gujarat Council of Educational Research and Training, Gandhinagar. The decision has been taken by the Governing Body of the GCERT during its meeting dated 10.12.2021.

NEP-2020:

The National Education Policy 2020 envisages that the curriculum and pedagogy of our institutions must develop among the students a deep sense of respect towards the Fundamental Duties and Constitutional values, bonding with one's country, and a conscious awareness of one's roles and responsibilities in a changing world. The vision of the Policy is to instill among the learners a deep-rooted pride in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development and living, and global well-being, thereby reflecting a truly global citizen.

IITE has formed criteria wise different 11 committees for better implementation of this policy. Meetings of these committees were organized for review of progress of NEP implementation at IITE. Presentations were also made for the same. A progress report of implementation of NEP 2020 at IITE was prepared and submitted to the State Government. University also appointed Dr. Divya Sharma, Professor, Centre of Education as a Nodal Officer for implementation of NEP 2020.



Research and related activities

Research Development Committee:

As per regulations of the IITE, the Research Development Committee has been constituted and notified. RDC met 5 times during this Academic Year mainly for GDPI of PhD Admission and to review the progress of research work of research scholars of IITE.

Research Advisory Committee:

Research Advisory Committees were formed for various Research Scholars as per provisions of Ordinances. Due to the pandemic situation of COVID 19, most of the RAC were held in online mode to review the research work of Research Scholars.

PhD Coursework Guidelines and Syllabus

Guidelines for the PhD Coursework has been prepared and approved by the Academic Council. Similarly, Syllabus for the PhD Coursework has been prepared and approved. UGC has prescribed 2 credit course “Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)” and it is to be made compulsory for all PhD students for pre-registration course work. This course is also approved by the Academic Council and made it compulsory as a part of course work.


PAR – NCTE: Staff Profile Endorsement

As per provision of the NCTE Act, 1993 and NCTE Regulations 2014, Performance Appraisal Report (PAR) is required to be submitted annually by the existing Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs). NCTE issued notice on 22.09.2021 directing all TEIs running NCTE recognized Teacher Education Courses to file online PAR for academic session 2020-21. Centre of Education submitted this PAR in due time. All affiliated colleges except 02 colleges filled online PAR in due time. Academic Branch informed all colleges about notice from NCTE for PAR submission and notice for extension of dates. Branch also helped colleges to solve their queries regarding submission of PAR. It was mandatory to submit copy of duly University approved staff profile for PAR. Academic Branch verified staff profiles submitted at University by various colleges and completed the process of attestation of these profiles.

All India Survey on Higher Education – AISHE:

Due to COVID pandemic during last two years, AISHE was not carried out for that period. But this year, AISHE portal was opened and data was invited for the year 2020-21 during December, 2021. The last date for data upload was 31.03.2022. This year, method and process was changed for the AISHE portal. The whole process was in online mode. Academic Branch collected data for the University and compiled it. Dr. Madhusudan Makwana, AISHE Nodal Officer of the University uploaded data on the AISHE portal before due date.

Academic Branch also informed and motivated all 59 affiliated colleges to participate in AISHE and upload data on AISHE portal. Branch helped various colleges in registration and trained staff of these colleges for data uploading. Online workshops were organized zone wise for training of AISHE data compilation and uploading by the AISHE Gujarat State Nodal Officer. All affiliated colleges to IITE uploaded data on AISHE portal before due date.



Public Grievance Portal - CPGRAMS:

Responding to applications received at Public Grievance Portal (Centralized Public Grievance Redress And Monitoring System – CPGRAMS) is an important task assigned to the Academic Branch. Dr. Madhusudan Makwana, Deputy Registrar is working as a Nodal Officer for CPGRAMS. During this year, 10 applications were received on Public Grievance Portal, 9 grievances were attended and disposed as per the rule.

RTI:

The Academic Branch received 6 applications under Right to Information Act, 2005. Branch responded to all these applications in time and as per provision of the Act. It also submitted Quarterly Reports to the Information Commission of Gujarat regularly during this period.

Registration Branch

The registration branch of the IITE has performed three major tasks :

1. Admissions, 2. Foundation Day Celebration and 3. Convocation Ceremony.

The registration branch of IITE put rigorous efforts to make education accessible for everyone and execute the above mentioned tasks as its core throughout the year.

1. Admissions

The admission process takes place in the following manner:

Encompassing entrance test (I3T) The common entrance test was carried out in order to initiate the admission process for various courses of IITE and affiliated colleges. The exam pattern was: 48 marks out of 120 marks to be eligible for the admission process. The exam was conducted at 39 centers.
Admission counseling Centralized counseling took place in 39 centers where students can go and get the admission based on their merit number.
Primary Eligibility Merit based : 1. Written test of 120 marks based on their attitude and aptitude.
Enrolment Last round took place on 29.07.2022. And based on ERP table enrolments will be generated.
Registration Final allotment of registration and refund of duplicate fees,& canceled admissions fees

Estate Branch

This branch of IITE is carrying out work to create and maintain physical assets, furniture, infrastructural, security, housekeeping, transportation, gardening and other logistic works related to the University and Hostel campus. Also branch supports the other branches who are allotted various tasks in IITE for upliftment of University.

The following works and activities were carried out by the branch during year July-2021- to Jun-2022.

- (1) Drilling of Tubewell
- (2) Building Repair and Renovation Work
- (3) Ground Cleaning & Plantation
- (4) Making the Swimming pool Operational
- (5) Parking and Cycle stand
- (6) Solid Waste Management
- (7) Boundary wall fencing
- (8) Class Room Arrangement
- (9) Fire safety
- (10) Deadstock Verification
- (11) New Campus plan & Design
- (12) Environmental, Energy and Green Audit

1. **Drilling of Tubewell:** Due to the scarcity of water for domestic and cleaning purpose during the summer season, Estate branch was tasked to establish a new water source by drilling a bore. After getting approval of university authorities, the task of drilling the bore was given to GWSSB which is a government body. The size of bore was decided as per the advice of government hydrologist. The size of the bore is 250 meters deep and 0.25 meter wide. The drilling of bore has been successfully completed.
2. **Repair and Renovation work: -**

Indian Institute of Teacher Education University was visited by 12B and NAAC peer review team due to which repair and renovation work was required.

 - (i) **Class room 111 & 114 renovation:** Classroom number 111 & 114 had old and weak flooring therefore to match all the other class rooms the flooring in these rooms was demolished and new flooring was constructed.
 - (ii) **Colour work:** Due to the visit of 12B and NAAC peer review team colour work was majorly necessary in the building as the building is 41 years old. The main gate, Front exterior of the building and almost all lobbies and classrooms were in need of colour work. Therefore estate branch was able to successfully complete this task.
3. **Ground cleaning & Plantation :-**
 - (i) **Ground Cleaning:** The campus land allotted to IITE is around 45600 Sq.mt. of area, where different outdoor games, competition & celebration of National festival are organized for the physical and mental development of the student. Therefore the levelling and cleaning of the ground has done time to time.

- (ii) **Plantation:** - The campus land which is allotted to IITE has a green area of 35745 Sqm in which fertilization process and installation of lawn was necessary. During the celebration of world tree plantation day, different types of trees were planted.
4. **Making the Swimming pool operational:** The Indian Institute of Teacher Education completed the construction of the swimming pool in the year 2019, Due to the pandemic swimming pool was not operational. As the NAAC peer review was scheduled to visit the university, making the swimming pool operational was necessary. The Estate branch was tasked to make the swimming pool operational, which was successfully completed before the NNAC peer review team. After the visit of the NAAC peer review team the swimming pool has been operational and regularly maintained.
 5. **Parking and Cycle stand:** There are approximately 900 students at IITE and out of those 200-250 are come with the bike and 50-60 with the cycle, The Estate branch was instructed to create a parking space for both 2 wheelers and cycles, Therefore a cycle stand and 2 wheeler parking area has been created near the security cabin and main gate.
 6. **Solid Waste Management:** Waste Management is considered highly important in the current era, Hence IITE take initiative towards zero waste policy, with primary segregation method whereas solid waste is divided into 5 categories (Plastic, Cardboard, Waste paper, Iron, Glass, Wood & Plastic Bottles). The Estate branch has also created a 2 nos. compost pit in which (bio degradable) waste is deposited every week and fertilizer is manufactured quarterly. That segregated waste materials is then sold to different vendors to help generate revenue for the university.
 7. **Boundary wall fencing:** The Indian Institute of Teacher education has 3 sides open in its periphery which is utilized by tree plantation. To protect the trees in that area, the Estate branch has fabricated a fencing around it. And to further protect the campus a new fencing on the compound wall has also been fabricated.
 8. **Class Room Arrangement:-** As the number of students keeps increasing in the campus the estate branch was instructed to increase the number of classroom in the building. Estate branch was successfully in creating 3 new classrooms in the building and provide the furniture for the same.
 9. **Fire safety:** The main building of IITE has a total height of less than 15 meters, Therefore, there is no need to establish a fire protection system. Although the estate branch has installed fire sensors in all rooms and provided various types of fire extinguishers in the campus to help protect the staff and students in case of a fire incident.
 10. **Deadstock Verification:-** The Estate branch is incharge of handling all the building assets and maintaining a deadstock register for the same. In this the estate branch has invited the dead stock verification committee for the verification of the university dead stock.
 11. **New Campus plan & Design:** The main building of IITE has been allotted by the Govt. of Gujarat and the building is 41 years old. Therefore construction of a new building is necessary. The estate branch had invited architects via tender process for the design of a potential new campus. Estate branch has then selected Kakani Associates as the architects for the same and MOU with the agency has also been done.
 12. **Environmental, Energy and Green Audit:** The university authorities had instructed the estate branch to get various audits for the NAAC peer review team. The estate branch has asked various agencies to conduct Environmental Audit, Energy Audit and Green Audit for the use and sustainability of the campus. As per their recommendation the estate branch has installed 30 sensor based light systems in all common areas and installed 13 solar lights all around the campus to make it even more sustainable.

Student Support, Culture and Welfare Branch

1. 10th Youth Festival 'Kalakunj-2021'



The Indian Institute of Teacher Education - IITE is committed to the holistic development of future teachers through teacher training. 'Kalakunj', the youth festival of IITE is organized with the noble purpose of developing true understanding of art, culture, literature and music among the youth. As the National Education Policy-2020 places special expectations on teachers, it is imperative that future teachers gain diverse experiences in all those areas. If innovation, creation and culture are integrated into the curriculum and the underlying academic and co-curricular-cultural activities, teacher training becomes meaningful.

The 10th Youth Festival 'Kalakunj-2021' was a unique program to showcase various arts, skills and abilities for the youth. More than 1200 participants from a total of 52 institutions were registered in Kalakunj-2021. The youth festival started with zone level competitions. In this phase various competitions were conducted via an online system. In this phase, 27 different competitions were held in 5 zones on 23-24 November in which a total of more than 1200 participating youth showed their talent and skills.

Taking into consideration the first three ranked winners from each zone per competition, as many as 1060 participants participated in the main 10th Youth Festival Kalakunj-2021 to be held on November 26-27, 2021 at IITE, Gandhinagar.

Kalakunj-2021 began with an inaugural ceremony on Friday, November 26, 2021.



In the inaugural program, there was a triple confluence of art, culture and technology. The program was chaired by Hon. Vice-Chancellor Dr. Harshadbhai Patel, Other dignitaries were Dr. T S Joshi (Director, GCERT), Mr. Anilbhai Chavda (Poet and Writer), Mrs. Aditiben Desai (Play writer and Director), Dr.

Nalin Pandit (Former Director, GCERT), Dr. Sudhir Tandel (Organizing Chairman) and Dr. Mehul Dave (Organizing Secretary) graced the stage.

The inauguration ceremony was meaningful in the presence of around 1060 students from various colleges, principals and professors of colleges affiliated to the university.

2. Cycle Rally



29th August is celebrated as National Sports Day across the country, IITE's Student Support Cultural and Welfare branch organised a cycle rally as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav on the day before National Sports Day. It was a perfect day for an early morning cycle ride. Several people gathered at the Raj Bhavan to spread awareness about patriotism, about health and hygiene.

Young teacher trainees, faculties and other officers of university, donning t-shirts and tri colour balloons tied to their cycles, woke up early and reached the Rajbhavan circle to

participate in the rally. Total 75 Cyclist participated in this rally to celebrate 75 years of independence of India.



The Flag off program was arranged near Rajbhavan main entrance gate. Beautiful wall decoration was done near venue displaying various freedom fighters and martyrs of Indian independence movement.

'Har Ghar Tiranga' is a campaign under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to encourage people to bring the Tiranga home and to hoist it to mark the 75th year of India's independence.

Our relationship with the flag has always been more formal and institutional than personal. Bringing the flag home collectively as a nation in the 75th year of independence thus becomes symbolic of not only an act of personal connection to the Tiranga but also an embodiment of our commitment to nation-building. 
4. Cultural Evening was organized for UGC 12B Team visit on 14th May 2022

Indian Institute of Teacher Education has implemented Information Infrastructure for digital smart campus through the various IT equipment such as CCTV, Access-Point, and Hotspot Router, Firewall, and Biometric devices and 1Gbps Internet Lease line connection with fully Fibber connection throughout the campus. Fibre Optic cables provides high speed transmission of data and also provide the opportunity to expand the network easily in case of need.

Information and Technology (IT) Branch plays a pivotal role; it is an important component of academic and administrative activity.

Internet: Fibre Optic Connectivity with Uninterrupted Internet service to all students, faculty, and staff with 1 Gbps high-speed internet through NKN Lease line internet connectivity. IITE has a total of 26 Smart Classroom and 2 seminar halls with Projector, LAN, and CCTV for smart Learning system, which increases the interaction of teachers and students.

Sonic Firewall: High-performance and reliable Unified Threat Management (UTM) from SonicWALL firewall provides protection from hackers, viruses, and worms over the Internet and dynamic network environment. Network protocols supported on SonicWALL include TCP/IP. DHCP is used to automatically assign a network address to each PC for the staff when it is connected through LAN to the campus network. Moreover, also supported on Router Gateway include TCP/IP. DHCP IP assign

automatically to each PC for the staff and students when it is connected through Wi-Fi to the campus along with MAC binding user authentication. Moreover, Analytics software Analyser is a web-based traffic analytics and reporting tool that is easy to use and provides real-time and historical insight into network health, performance and security. Analyser supports SonicWALL firewalls, backup and recovery products and secure remote access solutions.


IT Department handles; maintenance of internet facilities, management of E governance applications and maintenance of hardware. The software of the computers is updated regularly and new software installed as per need.




Dispatch- with Perfect Tracking Mechanism


Inventory Stock on a Click

The system helps the department to operate with easy stock management of stationery items and fetch the data for annual Stationery Stock Verification to be done within stipulated time.

Examination Branch

Every year university is conducting semester end examinations for various regular programs run by the university twice in a year and for the smooth conduction of the examination following various committees are formed according to ordinance and regulations of the University.



Examination department is doing the extensive use of the ERP for the various tasks related pre examination, post examination and during examination processes like exam form configuration, processing of the result, to get various reports from the system for smooth conduction of examination and for the easy understanding of the working of ERP, examination department provides help manuals to various stack holders like students, colleges, center coordinators etc.



Students need to fill the exam forms online and no need to visit the University as complete process is online through ERP, download the hall ticket, view the result and download the same, apply for reassessment and rechecking through ERP.

Colleges are able to upload the Internal and External Marks directly into the system and mark their students eligible/ not eligible to fill the examination form based on regulations of the university, view

the result of their students and access the office record for their students, verify and correct the examination forms of the students.

Center coordinators gets the course wise, semester wise and date wise count of the students allocated to their center, they can mark the attendance of students appeared for the examination through system only so at University we will get the real time data from across all the examination centers.

University adopted Digital Assessment, which enables evaluators to evaluate the answer books at their own convenience and pace and Online Question Paper Delivery System which delivers the Question Paper at designated time to the Center Coordinator login and after the proper authentication they are able to download the water marked Question Papers.

July, 2021 Examination

In the time of Covid-19 Pandemic, University Examination for Even Semester was conducted with all the safety measures of Covid-19 for various courses of IITE in month of July-August, 2021 at various 40 Centers spread throughout Gujarat, students were given the option of choosing the center of their choice so they can give the examination from the nearby center of their residence.



January- 2022 Examination



This approach seems novel in current era, but if we look at the ancient education system than we will find that in ancient time evaluation was done using method of Oral Examination only.



Batches of 12 students for each subject and course were formed and time of 30 Minutes each were allocated to each student for their evaluation for particular subject through Online Medium. To evaluate the subject knowledge of the student, panel of 2 examiners were formed, during allocated time to the students, examiners evaluated their subject knowledge by asking questions from the topics of the Syllabus. At the end of the day, each examiner use to upload the Mark sheet in provided link of Google Form by the Examination Department.


As it was a first time experience for the students to appear Online for Semester End Examination so to explain the process of Online Oral Examination and to address the queries of students, IITE organizes a special talk on 22nd January, 2022 through, Shiksharth- Initiative of Curriculum Transaction by IITE, with Prof. Bharat Joshi, Senior Professor, Gujarat Vidyapith, Ahmedabad and Prof. Jayna Joshi, Center of Education, IITE. Similarly to brief the examiners about the process and to solve their queries




examination department conducted Online Meeting for all the Examiners and also provided the Guidelines for Students and Examiners during the Online Oral Examination time to time.

During Online Examination Conduction, to deal with any technical issue and to provide the support to the Examiner and Students, team of dedicated technical support was formed at IITE and member of that team guided Examiner and Student, in case of any difficulty face by them. Technical team also make sure that

each google meeting hosted for conduction of examination get recorded.



In this examination like the normal theory examination, option of Reassessment is open for the students so in case student is not satisfied by the marks scored by him/her in particular subject they can apply for the Reassessment and based on the available recording of the examination, Reassessment process will be completed by the University.



Based on overall experience of this examination, it is found that in this method of examination, Universities are able to evaluate students in better way compare to other methods of evaluation exist as here examiner are having a chance of viewing the student expressions/emotions through video meeting and also able to motivate the students for better performance. There is less chances of unfair means in this method as student needs to keep the Video on from their device while attempting examination and need to show the photo identity proof online to the examiner before starting of the examination.

Prof. Viral Bharatbhai Jadav, Associate Professor, Center of Education, IITE prepared the Article on “Online Oral Examination: An Initiative by the Indian Institute of Teacher Education” and it got published in Vol. 60, No. 8, February 21-27, 2022 (ISSN-0566-2257) of University News, A Weekly Journal of Higher Education.

May – 2022 Examination

University Conducted Theory and Practical Examination for even semester in the month of May-June 2022 at all the 59 affiliated colleges and Center of Education and University allocated respective college of their study as examination center to them. During this examination question papers to all the affiliated colleges were delivered using two way authenticated Question Paper Delivery System to all the affiliated colleges and evaluation work was performed by respective college faculties for their students at college itself as per the instruction of the University.



To make the process of evaluation transparent, evaluated answer books were provided to the students to view in presence of university representatives on 01-06-2022 at all 59 affiliated colleges and in presence of representatives students viewed their evaluated answer books and due to that student got the chance to understand the evaluation work performed and also mistakes made by them in particular paper so in one way this process was like rechecking at student end.

Shree Kireet Joshi Library

About Library:

Shree Kireet Joshi Library, the Central library of IITE Gandhinagar, is located on the first floor of the main campus and is an easily accessible place to readers. The aim of the library is to facilitate the creation of new knowledge through the acquisition, organization, and dissemination of knowledge resources and providing for value-added services. Timings of the library are from morning 8:00 a.m. to evening 8:00 p.m. Library is fully air-conditioned with a reading area of 100+ sitting capacity and separate space for group discussions. The library is enriched with a precious collection of 13200+ Books and other resources like journals, magazines, Ph.D. Thesis, Dissertations, Textbooks, Reference Books, General Reading Books in English, Hindi, and Gujarati Languages, Special Collection for Competitive Examination (NET/SET/TET/TAT) and Research, Psychological Tests, Reports, Survey Reports, etc.

The library is fully automated and offers the following;

Library Automation (RFID):

The library is fully automated with RFID technology integrated with LMS- SOUL 3.0 and each of the functionalities such as Book Circulation, Stock Management, Library Security; Library Users Management, etc. are being carried out automatically without human intervention. For RFID service, Library has the following support services:



- **KIOSK:** Self-book check-in and checkout system through RFID

- **Drop Box:** Students can return the book in the drop box placed outside the library and take a receipt of depositing the book as well as receive the automatic mail alert in the mailbox.

- **Tag Tracker:** It tracks in and out time spent by the users in the Library. It maintains real-time statistics for library users.

- **Security Gate:** It is an antitheft security gate placed at the main entrance of the library to ensure the security of library books. It alerts if the unissued book/library resource is taken out of the library without proper processing. It is

also monitoring the footfalls of every user.

- **RFID Printer:** It prints RFID Smart cards for library users. Users use this card during the in-time-out time and issue-return of the books.
- **Hand Handler Machine:** It is used for stock verification and transferring inventory of the library.
- **Staff Station:** It is placed at the Circulation counter and used for processing Library Resources for RFID. All library operations can be carried out by library professionals through this device.
- **Camera:** It is used for capturing photos of library users to be inserted in creating the RFID smart cards of the Members.
- **Pen:** is used for inserting signatures of the member in the smart card.

Electronic Library Management and Automation:

For smooth and speedy functioning of library management and organization, the latest version of SOUL 3.0 is used which is provided by INFLIBNET Centre. RFID technology is integrated with the library database of SOUL 3.0. The library purchased SOUL 2.0 (Full Edition) on 2 January 2013 and upgraded

to the latest launched edition on 21 May 2021. To date, 13200 Bibliographic records of books are maintained in this database. SOUL software is compliant with international standards for bibliographic formats, networking, and circulation protocols.





Fig: Interactive WEBOPAC


Plagiarism Check Services:

The Union Ministry of HRD has launched the Plagiarism Detection Software (PDS) "Shodh Shuddhi" project. This service is being implemented by Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) an Inter-University Centre (IUC) of UGC which provides Ouriginal (Formerly URKUND) Plagiarism Detection Software (Provided by Ms Prio Infocenter AB, Sweden; Indian Partner: eGalactic) to enhance quality and prevent plagiarism in research/academic publications. Universities in India who have signed MoU with INFLIBNET Centre, get the software free of cost from INFLIBNET Centre. Indian Institute of

Teacher Education, Gandhinagar has signed MoU with INFLIBNET getting the software at free of cost from INFLIBNET and has taken the initiative to provide “Ouriginal” user account to all its Faculties of the University. As part of UGC and NAAC directives on research ethics and originality of research, IITE follows UGC and NAAC guidelines in detecting plagiarism in research by checking all research dissertations of the University (Ph.D., M.Phil dissertations) through the URKUND software. When a document is submitted to Urkund, it is compared to sources online, alongside our multiple academic databases, and also previously submitted documents. The most relevant sources are then singled out and presented in the analysis report, which will show a detailed view of how many paragraphs could be matched against these sources, as well as how significant these similarities are.

Graph: Usage count of Plagiarism Software (Yr 2021)





Other Facilities:
